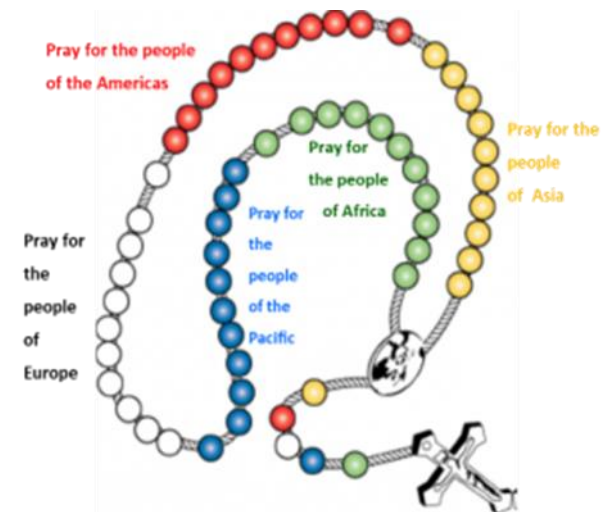

- a threat to the vulnerable is being held in Cathedral Hall, Nottingham (NG1 5AE) on Tuesday 15th October at 7.00pm. With Bills being introduced in the Republic of Ireland, the Isle of Man, Jersey, Scotland, and in the House of Lords, the possibility of a Bill in the House of Commons, the danger of the legalisation of assisted suicide within the British Isles has never been greater. The New Mass Lectionary

I am sure that many of you are aware that the Catholic Church will be using a new Mass Lectionary for the Scripture readings from the beginning of Advent. A four volume set costs £695. We will have to buy two sets, one for each church. There is also a study edition of the 4 volumes to be used for the planning of liturgy etc...which will cost £250. Having spoken to other parish priests I have heard that they have been inviting their parishioners to sponsor a volume of the lectionary set which works out at £175 or indeed a complete set! October is the month of the Rosary.

World Mission Rosary provides an opportunity to pray for the whole world, especially for those who are poor and vulnerable. It has been adopted by children around the world as their way of praying for global peace. Younger children pray a different decade each day.

Each decade of that World Mission Rosary calls to mind an area where the Church continues her evangelizing mission:

- The green portion of the rosary represents the forests and grasslands of **Africa**.
- The blue portion of the rosary represents blue for the ocean surrounding the islands of the **Pacific**.
- The white portion of the rosary white symbolizing **Europe**, the seat of the Holy Father, shepherd of the world.
- The red portion of the rosary represents the calling to mind the fire of faith that brought missionaries **to the Americas** and
- The yellow portion of the rosary represents the morning light of **the East, for Asia**.

Pope Francis calls for a Global Day of Prayer and Fasting amid escalating Conflict in the Middle East.

Pope Francis has called for a Global Day of Prayer and fasting on Monday October 7th to mark the one-year anniversary of the Hamas attack on Israel amid escalating violence in the region. Pope Francis said on October 2nd that the church is always at the service of humanity “especially in this dramatic hour of our history as the winds of war and the fires of violence continue to ravage entire peoples and nations.” He also said, “I am asking everyone to take part in a day of prayer and fasting for peace in the world.”

Pope Francis also revealed that he would personally go to the Rome Basilica of St. Mary Major on Sunday to pray the Rosary on the eve of the anniversary “to invoke the gift of peace through the intercession of most Holy Mary.” Accordingly, Bishop Patrick and the Bishops of England and Wales have urged us to respond to the Holy Father’s request and make it known to as many people as possible. A reflection from Pope Francis for the Year of Prayer, for the Twenty-seventh Sunday of the Year.

We consider those times when our prayers appear to go unanswered. We think, for example, of the heartfelt prayers we offer for our sick children, or for our friends who experience great pain. In our disappointment, we may feel that God is deaf to our pleas. Jesus taught us in the Our Father to ask for many things, but above all that God’s will be done. Jesus shows us by his own example that God understands our sufferings yet does not always immediately grant our wishes. In Gethsemane, Jesus offered a prayer that seemed to go unanswered; yet his complete trust in the Father’s will led to our salvation and the glory of the resurrection. If there are times when we walk in the dark, guided only by the light of faith, may we never abandon our trust in the Father’s will to make all things work together for our ultimate good.
